We therefore, enclose a form of application for amendment to change the point of diversion which you may execute and return to this Department for record.



Dear Mr. Beck:

We acknowledge receipt of the depositions of yourself and two witnesses, also affidavit of publication in the Mountain Home News, all in proof of beneficial use under Permit No. 19983.

Before final action is taken in the matter, the law requires that a field examination be made by an engineer from this Department.

We cannot say just when this examination will be made, but Mr. Tolman, Field Engineer for this Department, will try to contact you at the time he makes the examination, so that you may show him over the project.




