Dear Karl:

The enclosed plan is filed to comply with your March 10, 2004 Amended Order "In the Matter of Distribution of Water to Water Rights Nos. 36-15501, 36-02551, and 36-07694" (the Rangen Order). Gary and Helen DeMoss hold ground water right 37-7385B which is in Water District 130 and is junior in priority to July 13, 1962. Ground water right 37-7385B is presently not part of the North Snake Ground Water District (NSGWD). However, NSGWD has informed the DeMösses that they may petition to join the ground water district.

The DeMösses have already had Corrie Skinner (IDWR Twin Falls) look at their plan. When Mr. Skinner recommended additional review, our firm was contacted this Wednesday, March 10. We immediately asked Greg Sullivan of Spronk Water Engineers to review the plan. Mr. Sullivan's availability has been limited this week. In addition, he will be attending a technical meeting on March 16 in Boise directed to the ground water modeling used in the Rangen Order.

For these reasons, although the plan is being filed today to comply with the March 12 deadline, it may be revised pending Greg Sullivan's review. We anticipate that review would be completed following the March 16 meeting.

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We appreciate your consideration of these circumstances.

Re: Mitigation plan for ground water right no. 37-7385B in Water District 130

Dear Mr. Dreher,

We applied for and were granted a permissible place of use (PPOU) in 2003 to allow flexibility of water use during the irrigation season. In this PPOU we included the 124 acres of ground irrigated by ground water right no. 37-7385B. This allows use of Bray Lake surface water rights to irrigate the 124 acres in years when surface water is available.

Before the PPOU was granted, the ground water right was used as a primary source (up to 496 acre feet per year) of irrigation. Every year the ground water is not pumped, the incidental recharge from Bray Lake surface water will add to the aquifer. This could be credit for recharge on this ground water right. It is economically beneficial to use Bray Lake water instead of the ground water since pumping and pressurization costs associated with the well are eliminated, ensuring that the well would not be used during adequate surface water years.

The following is a record of water available from Bray Lake since we have owned Bray Lake Ranch.

Ten years out of the past 14 years would have allowed us to preserve and recharge the ground water right.
