Re: General Provisions for Basin 34 Meeting

Dear Interested Party:

On December 9, 1998, the SRBA District Court requested a supplemental report from IDWR on its season of use and general provision recommendations in Basin 34. IDWR intends to submit that report to the court, and mail pertinent copies to Basin 34 claimants, on May 7, 1999. Before it does so, we would like to share our preliminary recommendations with interested parties to determine whether some consensus can be reached within Basin 34 regarding these issues.

IDWR will be hosting a meeting to share and discuss its preliminary recommendations on **Wednesday, March 31, 1999, at 7:00 PM in the Butte Middle School Auditorium, 120 S. Water Street, Arco.** We will present and distribute the recommendations, and will invite discussion. For those interested in working to modify the recommendations, we will consider establishing one or more followup sessions.

The mailing list for this letter is enclosed. In addition, we are publicizing this issue in the local media. Attendance by any interested party is welcomed.

**Conjunctive Management and
Season of Use in the Test Basins**

- > On December 9, 1998, the SRBA District Court requested supplemental reports for the Test Basins regarding conjunctive management and season of use.
- > The order requested that the reports be filed within six months -- mailout date is May 7, 1999.
- > The Court ordered approximately 30 days for objections and 30 days for responses.



Background on Season of Use

- > Initial Director's Report for Basin 34.
 - > For surface water rights IDWR generally recommended the U.C. Decree season of 5/1 through 10/15 with a general provision of 4/20 through 10/31 in the water master's discretion.
 - > For ground water IDWR recommended a season of 4/15 through 10/31.
 - > General provision for early and late season irrigation.



Background on Season of Use

- > District Court Alternative
 - > Decreed "Irrigation Season"
 - > No general provisions
- > Idaho Supreme Court Decision
 - > Must have beginning and end dates
 - > Remanded general provision to District Court
 - > Supreme Court support of general provision regarding early and late irrigation questionable in light of its rejection of excess water provision

 **Basin 34 Season of Use Proposal**

- > Has been managed as a Water District.
- > Water delivered pursuant to the U.C. Decree or Licenses.
- > This is the historic practice in the region.
- > Only 9 objections were filed to season of use under the IDWR's original director's reports.

 **Basin 34 Season of Use Proposal**

- > Licensed rights: recommend the licensed season of use.
 - > Generally⇒ 4/1 or 4/15 through 10/31
 - > Early/late season remark for those ground water rights with seasons narrower than 4/1 to 10/31
- > Decreed and Beneficial Use surface water rights, generally:
 - > Recommend the U.C. decree season of use⇒ May 1 through October 15.
 - > Early and late season remark⇒ 4/20 through 10/31 if reasonably necessary.

 **Basin 34 Season of Use Proposal**

- > Beneficial use ground water rights:
 - > 4/1 to 10/31

 **Background on Conjunctive Management**

- > "Conjunctive"--joined together.
- > Conjunctive management in the water right context recognizes the interconnection between sources.
- > It is generally used in the context of managing interconnected ground and surface water sources.

 **Background on Conjunctive Management**

- > Conjunctive management in Basin 34 involves Basin Wide issues 5 and 5B
- > Thus, IDWR will be making Amended Director's Reports on all related general provisions

 **Basin Wide Issue 5--Basin 34 Provision**

- > IDWR's Original Recommendation (1992 & 1995):

Some ground water rights in the list of water rights are described as being administered separate from the Big Lost River and its tributaries. All other ground water rights not so described will be administered as part of the Big Lost River and tributaries.

 **SRBA District Court (1996)**

- > 1st: The general provisions are invalid because they do not apply to all rights.
- > 2nd: The general provisions are not necessary because of the existence of IDWR rules.
- > 3rd: The court has already determined that all water in the Snake River Basin is interconnected unless proven otherwise by a preponderance of the evidence.

 **Idaho Supreme Court (1998)**

- > 1st: General provisions need not apply to every water right.
- > 2nd: Agreed that most, if not all, water in the Snake River system is interconnected.

 **Idaho Supreme Court (1998)**

- > 3rd: IDWR's conjunctive management rules do not necessarily overlap the SRBA proceedings.

Remanded to the SRBA Court to decide whether inclusion of general provisions on conjunctive management of the interconnected waters is necessary for definition or efficient administration of the decreed water rights.

 **Basin-Wide Issue 5B Provisions**


- > Provision 2.a.--Division of the River at Mackay Reservoir.
- > Provision 2.b.--The streams administered as separate from the surface waters of the Big Lost River: Rock Springs Creek [and 14 other named creeks].
- > Provision 2.c.--Treatment of the Back Channel

 **Basin-Wide Issue 5B Provisions**

- > Provision 4.a.--50 cfs minimum stream flow below Mackay Reservoir.
- > Provision 4.b.--Rotation of water rights into the Mackay Reservoir for credit.


 **Basin-Wide Issue 5B**

- > The SRBA District Court struck these provisions.
- > The Idaho Supreme Court reversed and remanded these provisions to determine whether they are necessary the efficient administration or definition of water rights.




IDWR'S BASIN 34 PROPOSALS

- 1. The following definitions apply to these provisions:
 - a. The Howell gage is located above Mackay Reservoir in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 30, Township 8 North, Range 21 East, B.M.
 - b. The 2-B gage is located below Mackay Dam in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 18, Township 7 North, Range 24 East, B.M.
 - c. Mackay Reservoir is "full" when the water surface elevation of the reservoir is at the spillway crest elevation of 6066.12 feet above mean sea level.



IDWR'S BASIN 34 PROPOSALS

- 2. Mackay Dam and Reservoir shall be operated to maintain a minimum flow of 50 CFS at the 2-B gage. This 50 CFS shall be deemed unavailable for delivery to surface water rights below Mackay Dam outside the irrigation season.



IDWR'S BASIN 34 PROPOSALS

- 3. Water rights that do not include storage as a purpose of use may not be stored. However, surface water rights below Mackay Dam and Reservoir have historically been rotated into storage, with the approval of the Director of the Idaho Department of Water Resources and the Big Lost River Irrigation District, when such practice improves the efficiency of water use as contemplated by the Irrigation District's plan of operation. Such historic practice may continue so long as any water stored under such a rotation, if not used in the same irrigation season in which it is stored, shall revert to storage water of the Big Lost River Irrigation District at the end of the irrigation season.



IDWR'S BASIN 34 PROPOSALS

- 3. Cont.
 - Rotation into storage cannot occur prior to the need for irrigation water on the land, in any year; water rotated into storage may only be used on the land to which the water right being rotated is appurtenant; if the reservoir fills after rotation has begun in any year and 1905 priority natural flow water rights are able to receive water, all rotation credits are lost and all water in the reservoir at the time it fills reverts to storage water of the Big Lost River Irrigation District.




IDWR'S BASIN 34 PROPOSALS

- > 4. The Back Channel, which separates from the main channel of the Big Lost River in the NE¹/₄NE¹/₄, Section 5, Township 8 North, Range 22 East, B.M., shall be administered as part of the natural channel of the Big Lost River. The flow in the Back Channel shall be administered as follows:



IDWR'S BASIN 34 PROPOSALS

- > a. When the flow at the Howell gaging station is less than 1400 CFS, the flow in the Back Channel shall be kept as near as practicable to 150 CFS, but shall not exceed that amount.
- > b. When the flow of the Howell gaging station is at or exceeds 1400 CFS, the flow in the Back Channel shall be kept as near as practicable to 200 CFS. The flow shall not exceed that amount unless all surface water rights existing at the time of administration (including water rights with a junior priority), and that are within their period of use, are satisfied.
- > c. These provisions shall not be considered to enlarge the amount of water to which appropriators diverting from the Back Channel are entitled.



IDWR'S BASIN 34 PROPOSALS

- > 5. The following surface water rights from the following sources of water in Basin 34 shall be administered separately from all other surface water rights in Basin 34:

> Water Right No. Source




IDWR'S BASIN 34 PROPOSALS

- > 6. The following Big Lost River water rights in Basin 34 shall be administered separately from all other non-storage, surface water rights in Basin 34 from the Big Lost River downstream of the Mackay Reservoir during the irrigation season before the time on the rising stage of the River when the flow at the Howell gage reaches 750 CFS, and after the time on the falling stage of the River when the flow recedes to 300 CFS:

> Water Right No. Source

IDWR'S BASIN 34 PROPOSALS

- 7. Except as provided in provisions 5 and 6, all water rights within Basin 34 are from connected sources of water in the Snake River Basin and shall be administered conjunctively.
