DECREE.

This cause duly coming on for hearing upon the Complaint in Intervention of the above named Intervenors, the said Intervenors appearing in person and by Barber & Barber, their attorneys, and no one of the other parties to said action appearing, and the default of each and every of the said parties having been heretofore duly entered herein; the court having seen and understood the pleadings and issues herein, and having heard the evidence by said Intervenors adduced, and having made and filed Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law herein, it is in accordance therewith and by virtue of these premises and of the law, ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED:

That the said Intervenors are the owners, in common, of the right to divert from the Boise river, at the headgate of the New Dry Creek canal, and through the same, with priority as of the 1st day of June, 1870, for use upon the following described lands in Ada county, Idaho, situate, to-wit:

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of section fifteen, township four north, range one east of the Boise Meridian, situate, lying and being south of the Boise-Middleton Highway, commonly known as the "Valley road"; all that portion of the Southwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of said section fifteen lying and being south of said Valley road; and all that portion of the Southwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter of said section Fifteen situate north of the Boise river, consisting of 20.8 acres; all aggregating 71.4 acres;

a sufficient quantity of the waters of said river to properly irrigate said lands under an efficient and economical administration of said waters, not exceeding however forty and eight-tenths (40.8) miners inches, measured under a four inch pressure, the quantity prayed for in the said complaint;

That the said C. B. Frank is the owner of the right to divert from said Boise river, at the headgate of said New Dry Creek canal, and through the same, with priority as of the 1st day of June, 1879, for use upon the following described lands in Ada county, Idaho, situate, to-wit:

The Northwest Quarter of the Northeast Quarter of section fifteen, township and range aforesaid, and all that part of the southwest quarter of the Northeast quarter and the Northwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter situate, lying and being north of said valley road;

a sufficient quantity of the waters of said river to properly irrigate said lands under and efficient and economical administration of said waters, not exceeding, however, fifty miners inches, measured under a four inch pressure, the quantity prayed for in the said complaint.
